Christmas and New year is always a busy time for the police and other emergency services and 2022 was no different.

We've had some great successes including arresting four people on suspicion of burglary after a spate of burglaries in the Harworth area and also another two people being arrested following several land rover thefts.

We have continued to disrupt drug supply in the area with several warrants being executed and a variety of drugs and weapons being seized.

I also attended the Cabinet CMT meeting at Bassetlaw district council where I shared our priorities for this quarter (Drug supply, ASB and vehicle crime), how we have been tackling them, our successes and what our demand picture looks like. It's always a difficult balancing act managing demand and limited resources but we are certainly moving in the right direction.

Happy New Year from myself and my Team

December was a busy month for us Policing the World cup and Christmas within the town Centre. Town was very busy but everything appeared to run smoothly with just a few incidents that needed to be dealt with.

Officers were out in force during the Christmas shopping period actively deterring and dealing with shoplifters.

During this period a male was arrested for burglary, fraud and shoplifting and was charged with 14 counts of fraud, burglary and 4 shop thefts

Another male was arrested and charged with 9 shop thefts who was remanded to appear in court.

A female was also arrested for 4 shop thefts and was charged to court for theses offences

We have had some positive results from Court this month for two individual who have been riding motorbikes and electric bikes through the Town Centre with no license or insurance. Both have received point on their licenses and also substantial fines

The team will have some engagements and operations planned over the Neighbourhood Policing Week of Action (W/C 23/02/23)— keep an eye out on our social media for further details.

EAST BASSETLAW

Firstly, my team and I hope you all had a great Christmas and New Year. December was another eventful and busy month.

The whole team were proactively patrolling Retford Town Centre so we could prevent and deal with any shop thefts throughout the busy Christmas shopping periods. It certainly worked, and the team detained several shoplifters and recovered most of the property stolen, some being high value thefts from the stores.



The team just happened to be in the right place at the right time, many detained by officers covertly working within the town.

We also have several offenders now waiting for court appearances as a result and will look to put more restrictions on those who regularly commit theft from the Town.

We have had a spate of commercial burglaries within Retford, and I am hoping by the next stakeholder I can update you on all that we are doing, but rest assured we know who we are looking at and we will do everything to get the offender/s into custody.

The team were busy being involved in patrolling Worksop and Retford during the world cup during match times, for reassurance and to respond to any disorder. Luckily, we did not encounter many issues and it was relatively trouble free leading up to Christmas and throughout the world cup period.

Unfortunately, Harworth has seen an increase in dwelling burglaries throughout December, however due to some good proactive work, four individuals have now been arrested. All have bail conditions which are being robustly policed.

Enquiries are also underway after several stolen vehicles were recovered at a compound near to Cottam. This investigation is being led by Lincolnshire Police as the vehicles were stolen from their area.

My team are busy planning some dates for Op GALLIEO rural patrols, so please look out for further information on our social media.

We are also looking at planning warrants, premise closures, and several community engagements during our Neighbourhood Policing week of action towards the end of January, so will update you in the next Stakeholder.

5th December – Whilst on patrol, the team located a male in the Sandy Lane area who was wanted for numerous offences including burglary and robbery. The male was remanded into custody and found guilty at court.

14th December – Using ANPR, the team identified a vehicle that was believed to have been driven by a male wanted for burglary by West Yorkshire. Working with colleagues from RPU, the vehicle was stopped on the A1 North and the wanted male was arrested and presented to West Yorkshire colleagues.

15th December – Following the ID of a suspect of a burglary, the team located the female and arrested her at her home address. A section 32 search of the address recovered clothing that was used during the offence.

18th December – During Operation December, two drink drivers were arrested and presented to custody.

22nd December – Having been wanted for several days for high risk DV offences, the suspect was talked into handing himself in where he was then arrested and remanded to court.

29th December – Immediately following a suspect being escalated to a manhunt, the team gathered intelligence about the whereabouts of a male wanted for possession of a firearm. Acting on this, the male was located in an address in Manton and arrested.

30th December – The team executed a drugs act warrant in Manton where a large quantity of Mamba was recovered. The team later located a male believed to be involved in a series of burglaries in Harworth and was arrested for drug driving.

31st December – Following further investigation into a series of dwelling burglaries in the Harworth area, two further suspects were identified. The team located both males in Harworth, as well as the vehicle that they were using the commit the burglaries, which turned out to be stolen.
